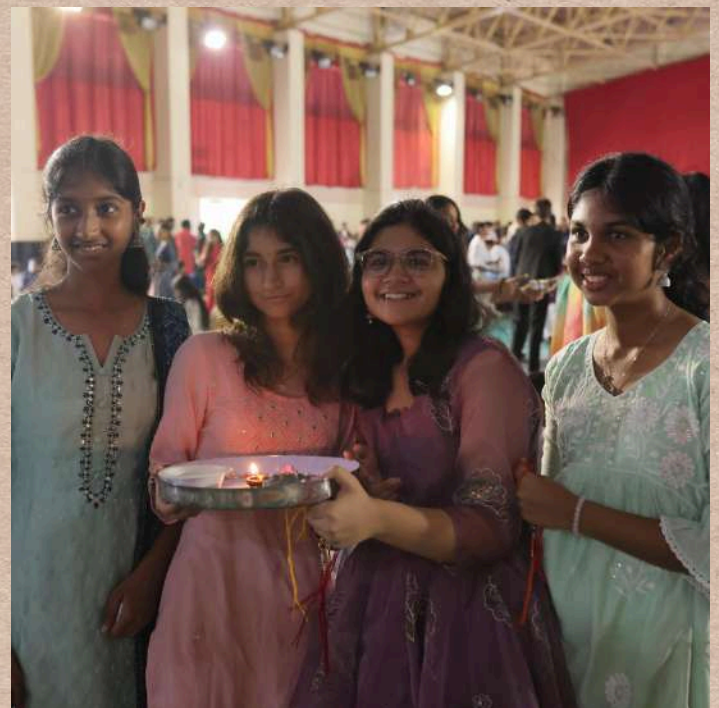


Celebrations

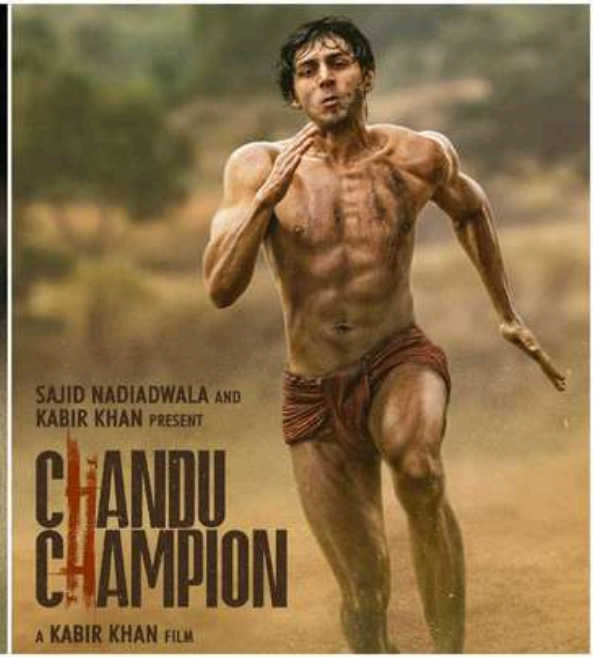
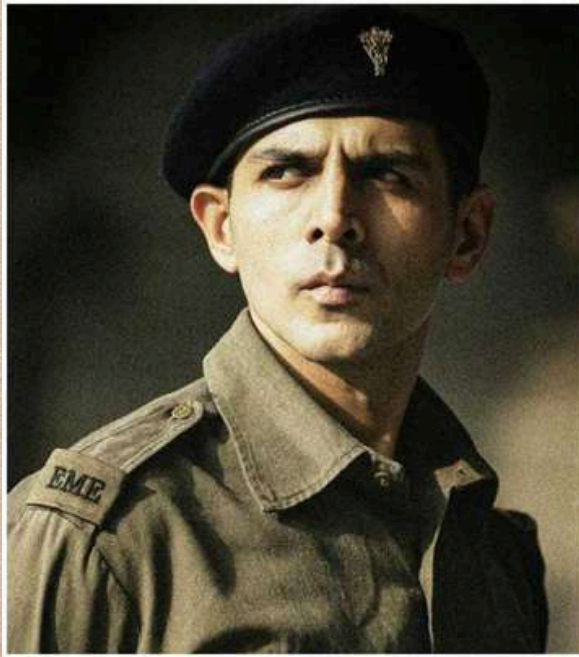
