It's another exciting week at JIRS, where our students immersed in enriching activities ranging from intellectual challenges in the classroom to thrilling outdoor experiences.

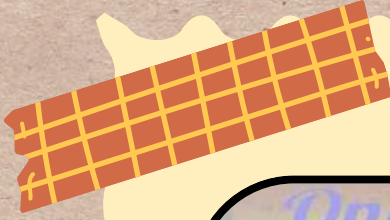

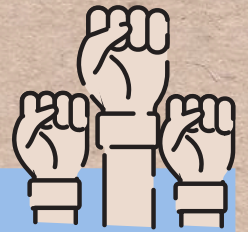
This fun and educational experiment gave them a deeper understanding of how clouds form and why they are vital for weather patterns.

Voices for Change: Skits for a Better Tomorrow!



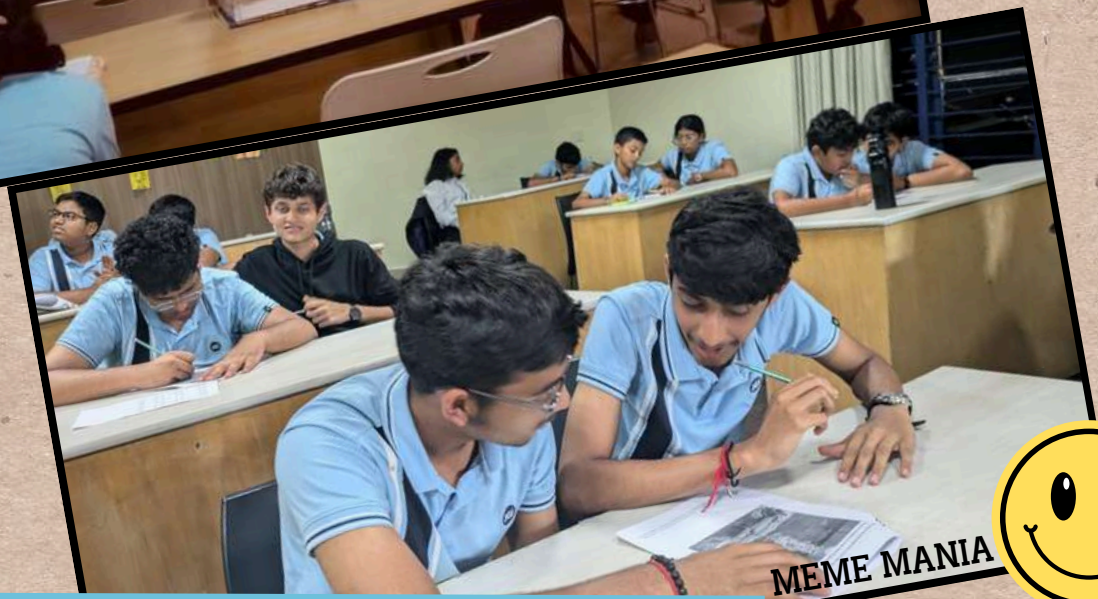

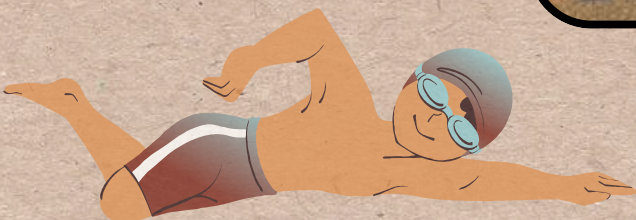
JIRS Swimmers in CBSE Clusters- South Zone 2 Competition

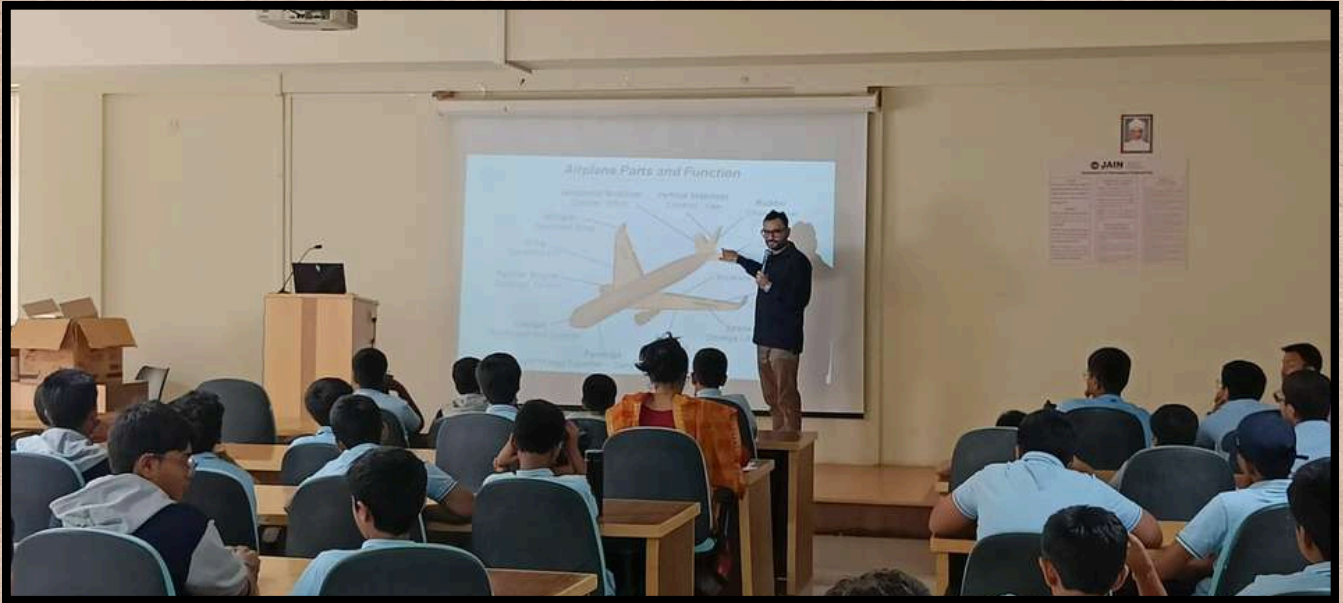
Management the Game: Finance Made Fun!
